# THE COMPASS - Pat McKinley

Share Your Love of the Mountains and the History and Stories of the Trail

Each of us is unique in how we see the world around us and therefore, how we describe what we see and enjoy. Our unique view of the wonders of the mountains gives us an opportunity to enhance our BPX trips when we lead others into the wilderness. As a beginning, we have skills for organizing and leading trips into the wilderness which are a necessary element for the participants' safety and comfort while navigating the BPX adventure. Some of these skills have been discussed in previous articles. How can we enhance the participants' experience beyond arriving at the trailhead adequately equipped and at the destination safely?

Colorado has an interesting history to be explored as part of each BPX trip. A brief investigation provides good stories and interesting destinations. A popular BPX destination many of you are familiar with is Lost Creek Wilderness Area. The Goose Creek entrance provides the most popular route into the southeastern park, to a ghost town and purposed reservoir site. The history of the ghost town where men lived while working on the potential reservoir is great fun and provides the trip leader with stories to share. The geology of the area is beautiful and provides opportunities for those interested in photography or exploring the unique rock formations like Harmonica Arch. Lost Creek Wilderness was one of the last refuges for the original Colorado bison herd and now has elk, mountain lion, bear and great fishing. In short, it provides the

BPX leader with a sampling of Colorado at its best. Given a little research online and in libraries, a trip leader can easily find many ideas and information to enhance the participants' experience.

# **Q&A With Backpackers Bob & Bobbi**

Dear Backpackers Bob & Bobbi,

One of my goals as a new BPX leader is to review and update the first aid kits I carry on overnight backpacking trips. I currently have 2: (1) a smaller kit for when I am a guest on someone else's trip, and (2) a larger kit when I'm leading a trip.

What are the essential items that I should have in my personal first aid kit? And what additional items should I include if I'm the trip leader?

Dear First Aid Freddy,

Let's start by looking at what every BPX member should be carrying in their personal first aid kit for a typical 1- or 2-night trip. For longer trips, simply add more of the same items that are already in your kit.

One approach is to build your own kit by starting with <u>a list of suggested items</u> like the one included in the back of your WFA textbook and add or delete items based on (1) your skill level—what you've been trained to use, (2) what kinds of trips you typically do, and (3) the probability of experiencing a given injury or ailment. Another approach is to start with <u>a store-bought first aid kit</u> and add, delete, or upgrade items based on the criteria above.

#### Definite must haves include:

- Any prescription medications that you're currently taking.
- Any over-the-counter medications that you would normally use for common ailments. At minimum, you should have Tylenol or ibuprofen, Pepto-Bismol, and Benadryl.
- A variety of wound-care items such as gauze pads, large size band-aids, waterproof adhesive tape, moleskin (for blisters), and tweezers (also helpful for tick removal).
- A pair or 2 of latex or nitrile medical gloves.
- A quick reference manual for common first aid procedures. Most commercial first aid kits come with
  one, but you might prefer to custom make your own by jotting down some notes on index cards (e.g.,
  the ABCs, wound care tips, hypothermia, etc.) and storing them in a plastic Ziploc bag so they stay
  dry and legible.

**Pro-Tip:** You can save money by buying supplies in bulk and (1) splitting the cost with a backpacking buddy or two and/or (2) by putting extra supplies that you don't need for your backpack in your vehicle or home medical kits.

After each trip, be sure to check your first aid kit and restock or replace used and expired items as needed.

And remember, more important than the first aid supplies in your pack is the medical knowledge you carry in your head. If you haven't done so, we strongly encourage you to take <u>CMC's 2-day Wilderness First Aid class</u>.

Next month we'll consider what additional items should be carried by BPX leaders for multi-day trips.
