#### **Colorado National Monument Camping Trip**

I do enjoy backpacking, but I have to say this camping trip was awesome—happy hour each evening with hors d'oeuvres and adult beverages, real food with each of us taking turns providing a meal, and running water and flush toilets! We were fortunate enough to have perfect weather with warm, sunny days to explore the Monument's trails and not too cold nights. We perched our tents on the mesa rim with great views of the Colorado River valley below and had an up-close view of a majestic desert big horn ram strolling down the road. On our way back we scored reservations to hike up to Hanging Lake.






#### Goose Creek/Refrigerator Gulch Loop - Lost Creek Wilderness

## **BPX TIP OF THE MONTH**

#### **Keep Your Phone Alive in Cold Weather**

Apple and Google both recommend an operating temperature range of 32° - 95°F for their phones. As we head into the winter season, we often encounter colder temperatures. These can rapidly drain your phone's battery life and may even cause it to shut down right when you are about use your navigation app or snap that elusive picture of Santa yelling at his reindeer. Cold temperatures can also impact your phone's battery life indicator. This is because its battery works with a chemical reaction that slows down when it's cold. This makes your phone think it has less battery capacity even though its stored energy hasn't changed. In addition, your phone's onboard sensors can lose accuracy since they are calibrated to work within a specific temperature range.

To keep your phone alive in cold weather, you need to keep it warm. Carry it in an inside jacket pocket close to your body. If you want to keep it more accessible, you can use a thermal case like the <a href="Thermal Phone">Thermal Phone</a> <a href="Case from Cold Case Gear">Case from Cold Case Gear</a> or a beer koozie with a handwarmer. It's also a good idea to keep your phone in your sleeping bag at night, even on summer outings.

Besides keeping your phone warm, minimize the battery use by using your phone sparingly and change its settings to save the battery:

- Turn off location services except for the navigation app you are using
- · Close as many app as possible
- Set your phone to Airplane Mode and download maps ahead of time
- · Keep your phone in low power mode

If your phone does die from the cold, let it warm up slowly to prevent condensation from building up in the battery. Also do not charge your phone until it's warmed up since charging it while cold could permanently damage the battery.

So you don't have to leave your phone at home this winter—just protect it from snow and moisture and keep it warm just like you do for your favorite appendages.

P.S. As of Nov 15, all iPhone 14 users in the US and Canada can send Emergency SOS messages via satellite when outside of cellular and Wi-Fi coverage. In addition, they can share their location with friends and family with the Find My app via satellite. Apple will provide this service for free for 2 years but will most likely charge after that.

Android 14, coming out in mid-late 2023, is also projected to have satellite communication capabilities.
