IMPORTANT: Join the Wait List when "the roster is full"

Many hikes on the calendar fill quickly, but some members inevitably cancel as trip time approaches, so **sign up anyway** because wait lists *almost* always clear.

Worried about not knowing how trips work? Which trips to sign up for? About being too slow or fast? Review "Trip and Trail Etiquette and Related Suggestions."



Sign up for a New & Prospective Member Hike. They are offered two to three times a month and answer questions about trips,

schools, gear, hiking speed/pace, carpooling, and CMC member resources.



Read the <u>Ascending Hikes Section</u> <u>Member Guide</u>, a basic guide to hiking fitness, understanding speed/pace, elevation gain,

mileage and high point elevation. The Section is free and open to all members.

GET NOTICE WHEN A TRIP POSTS

Sign up for Trip and Activities Alerts & Notifications in the My Preferences section of your online CMC Profile. Learn by reading trip details – pace, distance, gain. Find trip leaders who suit your hiking style.

JOIN SPECIAL INTEREST SECTIONS

To help yourself, ask the CMC office to add you as a member of all activity sections you are interested in. Most are free and the others cost only a few dollars a year. Some sections send emails at a regular time each month to their members. Sections may be organized by age (ex. 21-40, 50+) or by activity (ex. backpacking, biking, climbing, hiking, skiing, family). Denver Group also has a Conservation Committee that works on open space agency issues.

BECOME A TRIP LEADER OR SCHOOL INSTRUCTOR



Note that many CMC classes are free or heavily discounted for trip leaders, so decide if that interests you. If it does, sign up for the <u>Trip</u>

<u>Leader Track</u>. Usually, people who attend a class are invited to apply as an assistant instructor in future class sessions.



THE FOUNDATION CLASS







Classes and trips are designed to teach the technical elements of rock, snow, and ice climbing and specialized skills to safely negotiate challenging terrain.

Wilderness First Aid. This two-day class usually is offered once a month. Preparation, pre-reading, instruction, and role-play. Prerequisite to becoming a trip leader or instructor.



Wilderness Survival School. No eating bugs, roots, or tree bark! Prepare for unforeseen emergency sheltering, signaling for help, plus staying safe and warm, because help may not come until the next day. Increase your odds of survival.




Beginner Snowshoe School. Learn about snowshoe selection and fit, clothing, staying warm, breaking trail, snow travel techniques, fall recovery.
