

# ATTENTION: ALL Denver Group Trip Leaders, Senior School Instructors & School Directors -

#### **Denver Group Leadership Scholarship 2025 CHANGES**

The Denver Group Leadership Scholarship is a program established in appreciation of our leadership volunteers who share their time, expertise, and passion with our members. The program provides financial benefit to support qualifying leader's efforts in furthering their education and skill development.

This program's initial year (2024) was very successful and has put us in the position to make improvements that expand this benefit and make it available to even more of our active leaders.

A few of the changes include:

- 1) The Maximum Scholarship amount has been increased from one hundred dollars (\$100) to two hundred dollars (\$200). Therefore, each approved Scholarship amount will be equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the Applicant's requested Denver Group School's tuition cost, but no greater than two hundred dollars (\$200) per course [i.e. The lesser of 100% of the tuition amount or \$200]; and
- 2) The minimum number of required trips needed to qualify for a scholarship has been reduced from six (6) trips to three (3) trips led in the prior twelve (12) month period. To qualify the applicant must have been the "primary" trip leader of the trip.

We hope you will take advantage of this scholarship benefit and register for some of our great courses taught by the Denver Group.

# **ATTENTION: Winter Trip Leaders**

The Avalanche Terrain Avoidance (ATA) course is a basic seminar and 1/2 field-day to help you recognize when and where avalanche danger may exist and how to avoid it. Sources of information and methods for planning avalanche-safe routes will be presented. Find out more **HERE**.

ATA is recommended for all CMC trip leaders (regardless of sport or season) and **required** for leaders who travel in snow-covered areas but do not travel in avalanche-prone terrain.

AIARE Level 1 (or equivalent) is required for trip leaders who travel in avalanche prone terrain.

#### 2025 Telemark Ski School

The Telemark Ski School - Denver Group has over 40 years of providing quality instruction to hundreds of students from all over Colorado and beyond! We help beginner, intermediate, and advanced-level telemark skiers learn and/or improve their telemark skiing skills.

The 2025 Telemark Ski School (TSS) offers 3 individual Sunday sessions: January 26, February 9, and February 23; all sessions take place at Loveland Ski Area. For each session, you'll be grouped with others of like ability and assigned your instructor for the day. The second and third TSS sessions in February may find you in a higher-level class, dependent on your practice and improvement from previous session(s).

The best way to use the School is to take at least two of the sessions and practice in-between. But taking all three is even better! This is YOUR year for telemark skiing--come join the fun!

Become a Trip Leader!

Stay active, explore more places, and make new friends.

The Backcountry Incident Management School sponsored an evening with the Alpine Rescue Team/JeffComm911 on 19 Dec 2024 at the Alpiine Rescue Teams's facility in Evergreen, CO. The purpose of the session was to hear what the people on the "other end" of a 911 call or an inReach message need from us, and what we can do to prevent having to call for search and rescue in the first place. Information from this session will be published in the next three newsletters. The first part, about calling 911, may be accessed here.

Some of the highlights from the Part 1 include:

In the event of an emergency/incident, **CALL 911**. Do not attempt to call the county sheriff or the local Search and Rescue team directly. The 911 dispatchers will make all of the subsequent calls needed.

The most important thing 911 needs is your **LOCATION**. This should be passed in the form of degrees/decimal degrees if possible. It is imperative that trip leaders know how to obtain their coordinates using smartphone apps before calling 911. (Note - there will be more on this topic in a future PSAR Corner article.)

Once you have called 911, **DO NOT TIE UP YOUR CELLPHONE** with calls to familty/friends. Keep your phone free to receive calls back from search and rescue elements and save your battery.

There may be long sections of silence during a 911 call because the operator is busy entering information or talking with another organization. **DO NOT HANG UP** during these silences, stay on the line until the operator tells you to hang up.
