A new reality is the possibility of wildfire impacts in your planned destination and looking ahead and being informed helps you make good decisions. A handy internet resource is the Colorado Wildfire and Smoke Map which lets you track the latest wildfire and smoke information with data that is updated hourly based upon input from several incident and intelligence sources.

# **Upcoming Pikes Peak Group Classes**

#### **ARC Pro Sport Lead Climbing**

Sat, Aug 24, 2024 - Sun, Aug 25, 2024

This class will teach participants the skills needed to safely lead sport climbs on their own, including basic leading technique, setting up a top-rope anchor, cleaning the anchor and rapping or lowering down, advanced lead belaying, bailing off a route, climbing movement, and falling practice. It is taught over 2 full field days at a climbing crag. Cost: \$95 for PPG members, \$125 for all others.

#### **PPG WTS - Wilderness Fundamentals**

Mon, Sep 16, 2024 - Sat, Sep 21, 2024

The Wilderness Fundamentals class is an introduction of important skills and back country knowledge to enable participants to independently plan and safely implement a day's outing in the great outdoors—away from civilization and all it provides. This class is a pre-requisite for many of our other PPG courses and will provide participants with a copy of *Mountaineering: Freedom of the Hills* that will be referenced in other courses! Make sure you have a good foundation of the basics before expanding your outdoor skillset. Cost: \$45 for PPG members, \$90 for all others.

#### **PPG WTS - Land Navigation**

Wed, Oct 9, 2024 - Sat, Oct 19, 2024

The PPG WTS - Wilderness Fundamentals Course is the prerequisite for this course. Students must have earned the "Wilderness Trekking School Student" badge to be able to register for this course. This course is the second course in the Pikes Peak Group's Wilderness Trekking School (WTS) curriculum. This course may also be a prerequisite for trips or other schools. Cost: \$30 for PPG members, \$60 for all others.

#### **ARC Pro Introduction to Self-Rescue**

Sat, Oct 12, 2024 - Sun, Oct 13, 2024

Students will learn a variety of self-rescue techniques applicable to climbing in the single-pitch environment. Skills will include rope ascension, getting hands-free while belaying, taking over a belay, counterbalance rappelling, using a technical ledge for a load transfer, and passing a knot while rappelling. Students should be able to independently perform a climber pick-off, escape a belay and pass a knot on rappel after completion of the class. The class consists of two full field days at a rock-climbing crag, with outdoor discussion, demonstrations and practice with instructor feedback/supervision. This class is applicable to climbers of all levels and is the prerequisite for the Intermediate Self-Resue class, which covers multipitch rescue techniques. Registrants should have basic rock-climbing skills to include safety checks, top rope belaying and rappelling. Cost: \$95 for PPG members, \$125 for all others.

### **Conservation Corner**

#### **Target Shooting on Pike National Forest**

The US Forest Service is proposing changes on how target shooting is managed within the Pike National Forest. Due to increased visitation and shooting activities, the risks to public safety have increased as well. The Forest Service has proposed three alternatives to the current situation. This proposal identifies specific locations to be developed as designated shooting ranges and outlines strategies for managing target shooting in the future. Three alternatives are currently under consideration, and public input is encouraged. A final decision is expected by January 1, 2025. There are several meetings for the public to learn more about these projects.
