WSG Founder Bob Beverly - Article in Delta Newspaper

In May 1950, a group of 20 people gathered in Rifle in a room above the fire station for the purpose of starting a CMC group. The idea was conceived a year earlier by Bob Beverly and Harry Harris during an early snowstorm on Castle Peak. In 1951, the CMC board of directors made it official. Bob Beverly was the 1st Chair of the Western Slope Group and served several terms. Bob passed away in 2019.

Conservation Corner

Statewide Efforts to Protect Big Game



Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) recently notified the BLM that elk, mule deer, pronghorn, and bighorn sheep populations are in decline because of the impacts of oil and gas activity. CPW developed a set of recommendations for the BLM with a statewide level proposal. BLM lands in Colorado are critically important to support wildlife migrations. High priority habitat types must be conserved for these wildlife populations to thrive. Of the 8.3 million acres of public lands the BLM manages, 48% provide habitat for mule deer and 52% provide habitat for elk.

In January, the BLM Colorado State Office announced a comment period for its statewide Draft Big Game Management Plan Amendment. The plan covers 13 million acres including 8.3 million acres of surface land and 4.7 million acres of mineral estates. The plan takes important steps to protect critical wildlife habitat from oil and gas impacts and it begins to recognize the negative impacts of oil and gas development.

However, the plan still leaves 86% of high priority wildlife habitat open to oil and gas leasing. In addition, it is out of step with the Colorado Climate Change Action Plan. Plan alternatives were identified by the BLM and a comment period ensued. The CMC Western Slope Group submitted <u>a comment which can be viewed here</u>.
