


Conservation Corner

The Colorado Mountain Club is More Than a Hiking Club



The CMC's founders drafted a mission statement decades ago that continues to be relevant today. It provides, in part, a mission to "encourage the preservation of forests, fauna, flora, and natural scenery." This reflects a dedication to proactively protect landscapes based on the intrinsic value of nature.

Stony Brook University ecologist Carl Safina explains: "Wild things create and live in the remaining beautiful places. As wild animals disappear, what is lost is the world's beauty." He urges us to care for the endangered species and other wild things in what remains of wild places not selfishly, but selflessly "for the sake of beauty and all it implies."

The inherent value of nature is finally recognized in the BLM's Public Lands Rule that was recently rolled out by the Biden administration. Conservation is now considered a land use and, in theory, should enjoy the same weight historically given pursuant to the multiple use mandate that recognizes extraction, ranching and recreation.

The CMC founders had the foresight to recognize the physical world as a sacred place. The founders not only saw the value of promoting and advocating for human powered recreation, but also the intrinsic value of selflessly advocating for the protection of wild places and wild things. As humans we don't need bobcats and bald eagles for our survival. Nor do we necessarily need to see to a healthy forest to enjoy a hike. But they need us. The flora and fauna do not serve us, we serve them.

- 4) Scroll down the page and click on "Save".
