
Conservation Corner

RIP 399 - Queen of the Tetons



Grizzly bear 399 was struck and killed by a car on October 22 south of Jackson, Wyoming. Followed by biologists, wildlife photographers and tourists for decades, 399 was the most famous and beloved bear in the world - an ambassador for grizzly bears. At 28 years of age, she was the oldest known reproducing sow in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem. The documentary "399: Queen of the Tetons" follows the bear over one season as she raises four cubs. The GORP Act

One of the conservation campaigns backed by the Colorado Mountain Club is the Gunnison Outdoor Resources Protection Act (GORP Act.) This fall, Colorado's U.S. Senators Michael Bennet and John Hickenlooper introduced a public lands bill that would increase protections for over 730,000 acres of land in the Gunnison

River Basin. The Act has been in the works for years with diverse groups supporting better protections of the area's rivers, valleys, mountains and lakes. While increasing protections, the Act also proposes the preservation of water rights, access for motorized users and mountain bikers, and the preservation of hunting and ranching rights. The Ute Mountain Ute Tribe is backing the Act, and there is overwhelming support from several municipalities and counties including the towns of Crested Butte, Gunnison, Ouray and Ridgway, and the counties of Gunnison, Delta, Saguache, Pitkin and Ouray. Although this is exciting news, Senator Bennet has acknowledged that acts such as these tend to stall in Washington D.C.

About Bears Ears National Monument



We are fortunate to live so close to treasures such as the Bears Ears National Monument. The Bears Ears proposal was led by several tribes including the Navajo Nation, the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, the Hopi Tribe, the Pueblo of the Zuni and the Ute Indian Tribe. The area includes over 100,000 cultural and archaeological sites. In 2016, President Obama established the Bears Ears National Monument by using his presidential powers under the Antiquities Act. A Collaborative Land Management Plan was developed which "synthesizes tribal perspectives for management." In 2017, President Trump repealed the national monument and replaced it with two significantly smaller, non-contiguous units. This reduced the area by over 80%. In 2021, President Biden signed a proclamation restoring the national monument to its original boundaries as well as adding 12,000 acres. The BLM initiated the development of its land management plan. Meanwhile, lawsuits have been bought by the State of Utah and others challenging President Biden's use of the Antiquities Act to restore boundaries of both Bears Ears National Monument and the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument.
