
Hitting the trail in snow, rain, smoke & hail? Be ready!







CMC Volunteer of the Month: Lisa Paige - Roaring Fork Group

Lisa Paige is a relatively new leader for the Roaring Fork Group. She volunteered for the role because she felt her comfort with technology is stronger than other members in the group. She could see this is quickly becoming a necessary skill for CMC leaders. Previously, the Roaring Fork Valley group was called the Aspen group. Lisa joined this group in 2010 after moving to the community, having been a member of the Denver group since 2008. Prior to that, she had been an extensive trail runner, often doing solo runs. After a particularly scary mistake descending Uncompahgre Peak on one of these solo runs, she realized that she needed to join a group. The RFV/Aspen group is ideal for her because it enjoys hikes, cycling, and snowsports in the most spectacular mountains of Colorado. She became a trip leader soon after joining, then moved to the group leader role last year. Highlights include great potluck events, backcountry hut skiing, and epic 14er hikes.
